An ATAR is for university entry

- Narrower range of courses
- Courses must have an HSC exam
- Academic pathway
- Reading, writing, research, problem solving, assignments, exams ...
- \$\$\$\$\$ HECS debt
- Highest attrition rate in Semester 1 of 1st year uni
- Many students are not ready for more study and that level



The rules

Preliminary Course Year 11

Minimum of 12 Units

Usually 6 subjects (6 x 2 unit)

Most students do 12 units, some do 13 units

Some do 10 dilita

The rules

HSC Course Year 12 Minimum of 10 units

Usually 5 subjects (5 x 2 unit)

Most students do 10 or 11 units



Preliminary and HSC courses must include

The rules

6 Units Board Developed Courses (including at least 2 Units of English)

At least 3 courses with a value of 2 Units or more

At least 4 subjects (including at least 2 Units of English)

At most, 6 Units of Science in Y11

At most, 7 Units of Science in Y12

At most, 7 Units of Science in Y12



1 or 2 units of Religion in Year 11 **ONLY**, not Year 12

Stella Requirements

Most do Studies of Religion Very different to Yr 7-10 Religion



Biggest course candidature every year in Year 12



Must complete school assessments

To qualify for a HSC

Make a serious attempt at HSC exams

Work with diligence and sustained effort to satisfactorily complete Prelim course before moving onto HSC course

Pass Minimum Standards Tests (Term 2 Yr 10)



HSC Minimum Standard online tests

- Reading: 45 multiple choice
- Numeracy: 45 multiple choice
- Writing: One question based on a visual or text prompt.

Attempt 1 for all Year 10 will be in the last week of this term

Can have multiple attempts in Yr 10,11,12
